Continuing the Fight for the Clean Deliveries Act
New York State leaders must act to protect public health and clean air

ALBANY, NY - The 2026 New York State legislative session came to a close this month after the delayed NYS budget negotiations. With the current climate's need for public health and clean air protections, the ElectrifyNY Coalition renews the call for clean deliveries, corporate responsibility, and thriving communities in the legislative session to come.

The following statement is attributed to the ElectrifyNY Coalition:

"The Clean Deliveries Act (CDA) made it through committee in New York State's (NYS) Assembly and Senate, but fell short of getting a vote on the floor before the end of the legislative session. Our coalition has continued to fight for the Clean Deliveries Act since it was first approved by the Senate three years ago, and we're determined to keep going. Thank you to Senator Gianaris and Assemblymember Mitaynes for sponsoring and championing this bill, and to the countless advocates who made the final push in the last hours of the legislative session.

"Although disappointed, we are not deterred. As e-commerce delivery continues to proliferate and drive warehouse and distribution center construction across the state, it is crucial that we create regulation that safeguards our health and wellness. Increased diesel truck traffic to and from warehouses is detrimental to air quality, increases pediatric asthma rates, and causes premature deaths.

"We are committed to the fight for the health of New Yorkers. This next legislative session, ElectrifyNY will be ready to return to Albany and work with lawmakers to advance the Clean Deliveries Act. Thank you to those who have stood beside us to put people over pollution and profit. We'll see you next session."
